Darach Cassidy from our committee will give us an insight on how to do risk assessments using the Bowtie method.

The bowtie risk analysis model is **used to help simplify risk assessment and support business understanding of risk**. Much like the name suggests, this style of risk assessment uses a format that looks like a bowtie. It enables users to conceptualise the interaction of causes, controls and consequences of a business risk.



This is a great chance for our members to upskill in a small classroom environment.
