	<ul> <li>Hazardous substances regulations - understand the types and quantities needed that may trigger a <u>location certificate</u> - this is a total amount of ALL those categories.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>WorkSafe have created an asbestos management plan <u>template</u>. As long as what needs to be managed isn't complex, this document is a big help.</li> <li>The inclusion of transport industry stats in <u>WorkSafe death statistics</u> - it's good to</li> </ul>
	see the anomaly addressed and it should be seen as the first step in verifying the PCBUs in this industry group have the required safe systems of work, management and governance practices to keep their workers safe.
