NZISM Webinar with Kate Milburn

Topic: Adopting a systems perspective towards Mentally Healthy Work

In this presentation, Kate Milburn (an organisational psychologist at Umbrella wellbeing) will share practical steps you can take to proactively build a mentally healthy workplace.
