MEET: KATE BROOKS NZISM CANTERBURY BRANCH COMMITTEE MEMBER





She has also worked for the United Kingdom Accreditation Service assessing quality management systems to ISO standards, and assessing technical competence of asbestos testing and inspection organisations. Kate now undertakes Technical Expert work for IANZ. Kate and her husband fell in love with New Zealand during a year long working holiday in 2009-2010 and made the permanent move to live here in 2013. Kate worked with Fletchers as the asbestos specialist in their H&S team, and is proud of the work done there to improve knowledge on asbestos and also improve the standards of removal work.
